

Executive Summary

The Special Review on Coastal Management of the Seychelles was part of a Coastal Audit project initiated by the AFROSAI-E in 2017. The aim of the project was to identify and bring forth the risk and challenges faced by coastal African countries to effectively manage their coastal areas. This was in consideration of relevant Sustainable Development Goals (SDGs) and Targets applicable to coastal and marine management. The Seychelles audit focused on five key areas namely Overall Coastal Management, Climate Change, Coastal Monitoring and Enforcement and Overfishing, as these were areas identified as significant to the Seychelles. The Audit also assessed the position of the Seychelles in regards to the implementation of the SDGs.

Through this Audit we noted that Seychelles was at its initial stage of the implementation of the SDGs. The Rapid Integrated Assessment (RIA) conducted in 2017 had revealed that the country had good mainstreaming of the SDGs within its National Plans and Targets except for 12 targets across 9 SDGs. Through the Audit we also noted that Seychelles also had a National Oversight Committee with the mandate to facilitate, oversee and report on the implementation of the SDGs. However the audit revealed that more efforts was needed to sensitize the public in regards to the SDGs.
